Project Summary:

The aim of this project is to facilitate KTE of findings from the Sisters, Mothers, Daughters and Aunties (SMDA) vaccine project that investigated barriers and facilitators to the future dissemination of HIV vaccines.

- ii) Development of fact sheets for distribution relevant stakeholder.
