**RESPONSIBILITIES:**

1. Perform excellent clinical assessments combined with sound clinical judgment/diagnostic and treatment skills – within full scope of practice in accordance with the College of Nurses of Ontario (CNO) standards of practice for Registered Nurses in the Extended Class (NPs).
2. Perform initial prenatal assessments prior to referring to Obstetrician and Midwifery
3. Complete timely and accurate medical records of client encounters, documentation and third-party correspondence using the Centre's Electronic Medical Record (EMR) system.
4. Contribute to activities related to the development, implementation and evaluation of medical directives, policies and procedures, best practices and clinical protocols
5. Participate in the development, implementation, monitoring and evaluation of treatment, education, counselling and health promotion programs and services for individuals, groups and the community.
6. Participate in chart reviews, case conferences and accreditation activities
7. May provide clinical supervision and training for NP students.
8. Ability to work a flexible schedule with at least one evening per week.
9. Perform other duties as assigned that are reasonable with scope of practice.

2. Registration in the Extended Class with the College of Nurses of Ontario
3. Hold a Prescribing Narcotics and Controlled Substances certificate endorsed by the CNO.
